Welcome to the University of South Australia Library

The Library is your partner in teaching and research, offering a wide range of services to help you find, use and manage information effectively. It plays a significant role in supporting your teaching, learning and research through the provision of relevant information resources and course specific workshops for students.

The Research Collection

Contains over 700,000 books and print journals together with a rapidly expanding collection of electronic resources of over 136,000 ebooks, 50,000 ejournals, 23,000 ereadings and 480 databases. Other resources include pictorial, audio visual materials and manuscripts.

Get to know your Academic Librarians

Each Academic Division and research concentration of the University has a team of librarians who provide training programs and resources to support your teaching and research. Copyright

The Digital Resource Service

Manages digital course readers in support of the University's teaching and learning programs and ensures that digital material is accessible and rights compliant. Summon

Summon is a fast and simple search tool that enables you to find relevant information on any topic from the Library's collection of databases, print and electronic books, journals and theses, together with journal and newspaper articles from numerous academic databases. You are able to limit your results to peer-reviewed materials, to filter by year and format, and to save references for export to bibliographic management software such as Refworks or EndNote. Summon and many other Library resources specific to your course can be accessed through learnonline.

Library Catalogue

All University of South Australia holdings are listed in the catalogue, which is accessible from the Library homepage. eResources can be accessed via the catalogue. Go to MyRecord to check or renew items you have on loan, check the status of requests placed, and any outstanding demerits or fees.

Assignment help

Borrowing

- You need your staff ID card to borrow and use the self service loan kiosks
- You can have up to 50 items on loan at one time, including bound journals
- You can borrow from any campus library
- You can request books from other campuses to be delivered to the campus of your choice
- You can request copies of journal articles from other campuses and we will deliver them electronically
- Please inform the University immediately if you lose your ID card as you are responsible for all items borrowed on your card

Loan periods

Main Collection

- 28 days (subject to recall)

High Demand and Restricted Loans

- 4 hour or 4 day loans

Reference Collection and Journals

- Reference items are not available for loan
- Bound journals can be borrowed for 4 days

Teaching Resource Collection (TRC)

- 28 days (subject to recall)

Requests

From the Library Catalogue you may request an item on loan to another borrower or held at another campus. When it is available you will be advised by email, and the item will be held for 4 days at the campus of your choice. 4 hour loan items cannot be requested.

Renewals

Items not in demand may be renewed up to 4 times. You can do this via MyRecord on the Library website or via the Catalogue.

Returns

You can return items at any campus through the chutes at the Library. After-hours chutes are available. 4 hour loans must be returned to the campus from which they were borrowed.

Demerit points

The Library uses demerit points to encourage the return of library materials on the due date. Borrowing privileges will be suspended at a rate of 1 week for every 60 demerit points.

Fees

Invoiced items incur a non-refundable fee of \$20 per item. The Library website has more details. www.library.unisa.edu.au/services/borrowing/demerits.aspx
