## Welcome to the University of South Australia Library

UniSA has five campus libraries, at City East, City West, Magill, Mawson Lakes and Whyalla.

Members of the Community are welcome to consult materials held on the open shelves at any campus at no charge and to borrow for a small annual fee.

The Research collection has over 700,000 books and print journals, together with a rapidly expanding collection of electronic resources of over 160,000 ebooks, 50,000 ejournals, 23,000 ereadings and 480 databases. Other resources include images, audiovisual materials and manuscripts.

Each library has different collection strengths which reflect what is being taught at each campus.

### City East – Division of Health Sciences

health sciences, biology, human movement, exercise and sports science, planning and building, transport

### City West – Division of Business

Aboriginal and Islander studies, accounting, architecture and design, business, management, marketing, law, art

### Magill - Division of Education, Arts and Social Sciences

communication, media studies, international studies, politics, social work and social policy, gender studies, psychology, languages and culture

### Mawson Lakes – Division of Information Technology, Engineering and the Environment

chemistry, computing and information technology, engineering, earth sciences, mathematics, physics, telecommunications, environmental studies, physical education, recreation

### Whyalla

business, nursing, rural health, social work, engineering, Indigenous health and social issues

### Summon

Is a fast and simple search tool that enables you to find relevant information on any topic from the Library's collection of databases, print and electronic books, journals and theses, together with journal and newspaper articles from numerous academic databases. You are able to limit your results to peer-reviewed materials, to filter by year and format, and save references for future reference. Restrictions and conditions apply.

### Catalogue

All UniSA items are listed in the catalogue, which is accessible from the Library homepage. You are able to access some eresources from the catalogue. Restrictions and conditions apply.

### Membership categories

Members of the community may apply for borrowing privileges for an annual fee of \$110. To promote engagement with our rural community, this fee is waived for Whyalla community members.

Alumni members may apply for borrowing privileges. An annual fee of \$33 applies. Contact the Alumni Network on 8302 0975 or 8302 0973 for a UniSA Alumni Network card. Present the card at the Service Desk in the library. Membership includes access to selected online databases, such as Gale Virtual Reference Library and Proquest Central.

Gold Pass members - by recommendation to the University Librarian.

### Borrowing

- To borrow you must bring your UniSA Library card and use the self service loan kiosks
- To become a borrower you must provide photo identification that includes your full name and current address
- You may borrow up to 20 items at one time from any campus library
- From the Catalogue you may request an item on loan to another borrower or held at another campus. When it is available you will be advised by email and the item will be held for 4 days at the campus of your choice
- Items not in demand may be renewed up to 4 times. You can do this through My Record on the Library website
- Please inform the Library immediately if you lose your Library card
- You are responsible for all items borrowed on your card

### Loan periods

Main Collection and Teaching Resource Collection

- 14 days (subject to recall)

### High Demand and Restricted Loans

- Not available for loan

### Reference Collection and Journals

- Not available for loan

### Returns

Items can be returned at any campus through the return chutes in the library. After-hours chutes are available.

Check at the campus for locations.

### Demerit points and fees

The Library uses demerit points to encourage the return of borrowed library materials on time. Borrowing privileges will be suspended at a rate of 1 week for every 60 demerit points.

Invoiced items incur a non-refundable fee of \$20 per item. See the Library website for more details.
