Welcome to the University of South Australia Library

The Library is your partner in research, offering a wide range of services to help you through every phase of your research project, to enhance your research skills, support your research output, and provide research opportunities.

The research collection

Contains over 700,000 books and print journals together with a rapidly expanding collection of electronic resources of over 160,000 ebooks, 50,000 ejournals, 23,000 ereadings and 480 databases. Other resources include images, DVDs, streaming media, Kindle ereaders and manuscripts. Many ebooks may be downloaded to your personal devices and read offline.

Get to know your Academic Librarians

It's never too early or too late to get in touch with your Academic Library Services team. We provide training programs and resources to support your research.

In addition to personalised, one-on-one support, your team conducts the Strategies for Successful Research series of workshops throughout the year in both an online and face to face setting.

UniSA Research Archive – promoting your research

The Archive is the University's institutional repository which showcases the research outputs of current and former UniSA staff and postgraduate students. It contains records of books, book chapters, journal articles, and conference papers along with PhD and Masters by Research theses.

Databases

Search scholarly journals, conference papers, ebooks and audiovisual materials on your topic. We offer sophisticated search tools to get the most from the information we provide. "How to" guides provide tips on getting the most out of these resources.

Save time, manage your references

Learning how to use reference tools such as EndNote and Refworks will save you time by making it easy to record and cite your references. Research Guides have been developed by the Library to support these useful tools.

Navigating the publishing maze

Library staff understand the scholarly publishing process and can recommend the most useful tools to find resources for you. We can help you access journal articles and show you how to track the development of ideas. If your research takes you to discipline areas outside your speciality, the Library's TopicLaunch provide authoritative, reliable, information resources on specific topics.

Copyright advice

You will be relying on copyright law to protect any work you create and to reproduce other peoples work in your research. Information is available from the University's Copyright website and the Australian Copyright Council's Resources for researchers and students.

Access to a world of information

You have access to Interlibrary Loans and the Document Delivery Service through which you can request material not available at UniSA.

Suggest new resources

We encourage you to recommend material to add to the Library's collection to support your research. Discuss this with your Academic Library Services team or fill in the online form.

Borrowing from UniSA

- You need your staff ID card to borrow, using the self service loan kiosks
- You may borrow up to 50 items at one time from any campus library
- From the Catalogue you may request an item on loan to another borrower, held at another campus or in the Offsite Warehouse. When it is available you will be advised by email and the item will be held for 4 days at the campus of your choice
- Items not in demand may be renewed up to 4 times. You can do this through My Record on the Library website
- Please inform the University immediately if you lose your ID card
- You are responsible for all items borrowed on your card

Returns

You can return items at any campus through the chutes in the library. After-hours chutes are available. Kindles and laptops must be returned to the Service Desk.

Borrowing from other Universities

As a student undertaking research at the University of South Australia you can borrow directly from the University of Adelaide and Flinders University using your student ID card.

Demerit points and fees

The Library uses demerit points to encourage the fair sharing of resources. Borrowing privileges will be suspended at a rate of 1 week for every 60 demerit points. Invoiced items incur a non-refundable fee of \$20 per item. The Library website has more details.
