Welcome to the University of South Australia Library

UniSA has five campus libraries, at City East, City West, Magill, Mawson Lakes and Whyalla.

The research collection contains over 700,000 books and print journals together with a rapidly expanding collection of electronic resources of over 160,000 ebooks, 50,000 ejournals, 23,000 ereadings and 480 databases.

Secondary school students are welcome to use the resources in our library. Students undertaking SACE may be eligible for free membership (conditions apply).

The collection at each campus reflects the academic programs and research strengths at that campus.

City East – Division of Health Sciences

health sciences, biology, human movement, exercise and sports science, planning and building, transport

City West – Division of Business

Aboriginal and Islander studies, accounting, architecture and design, business, management, marketing, law, art

Magill - Division of Education, Arts and Social Sciences

communication, media studies, international studies, politics, social work and social policy, gender studies, psychology, languages and culture

Mawson Lakes – Division of Information Technology, Engineering and the Environment

chemistry, computing and information technology, engineering, earth sciences, mathematics, physics, telecommunications, environmental studies, physical education, recreation

Summon

Is a fast and simple search tool that enables you to find relevant information on any topic from the Library's collection of databases, print and electronic books, journals and theses, together with journal and newspaper articles from numerous academic databases. You are able to filter by year and format, and save references for future reference. Restrictions and conditions apply.

TopicLaunch

TopicLaunch provides a launch pad to authoritative, reliable resources and information on specific topics, establishing pathways to assist you in beginning research.

Catalogue

All UniSA items are listed in the catalogue, which is accessible from the Library homepage. You are able to access some eresources from the catalogue. Restrictions and conditions apply.

Membership and borrowing

Check with your school or the UniSA Library to see if you are eligible for free Library membership. To join, bring your student ID card to the Service Desk at any library and fill in a membership application form.

- Parental permission is required for those under 18 years of age
- When borrowing, always bring your UniSA Library card and use the self-service loan kiosks
- You may borrow up to 20 items at one time from any campus library
- From the Catalogue you may request an item on loan to another borrower or held at another campus. When it is available you will be advised by email and the item will be held for 4 days at the campus of your choice
- Items not in demand may be renewed up to 4 times. You can do this through My Record on the Library website
- Please inform the Library immediately if you lose your Library card
- You are responsible for all items borrowed on your card

Access to electronic resources

Access to electronic resources is only available at a campus library using a Guest Access PC. Conditions apply. You will need a USB flash drive to save any work.

Loan periods

Main Collection and Teaching Resource Collection

Returns

Items can be returned at any campus through the return chutes in the library. After-hours chutes are available. Check at the campus for locations.

Demerit points and fees

The Library uses demerit points to encourage the return of borrowed library materials on time. Borrowing privileges will be suspended at a rate of 1 week for every 60 demerit points.

Invoiced items incur a non-refundable fee of \$20 per item. See the Library website for more details.
