Welcome to the University of South Australia Library

The Library plays a significant role in supporting the University's teaching, learning and research mission through the provision of relevant information resources and associated services.

This includes

- **The Research collection** with over 700,000 monographs and print journals together with a rapidly expanding collection of electronic resource holdings, including over 32,000 electronic journal titles, 24,000 ebooks, 16,000 ereadings and 350 databases. Other resources include manuscripts, pictorial and AV materials
- **arrow @UniSA.** A digital archive showcasing the University of South Australia's research and intellectual output to the world
- **Academic Library Services.** Designated teams of librarians design and deliver value added services tailored for the learner, teacher, researcher and scholar
- **Copyright advice.** Guidance about rights and responsibilities on copyright issues which might arise through the use of third party copyrighted works
- **The Digital Resource Service** manages digital course readers in support of the University's teaching and learning programs and ensures that digital material is access and rights compliant. Access is provided to all digital readings via the Library Catalogue and Course home pages
- **The Off Campus Library Service** provides phone and online assistance in the use of the Library's resources and services. It also provides electronic and postal delivery of documents and items for loan to external students of UniSA

Staff and students of the University may borrow from and use any Library at any campus and other Australian university libraries.

Library catalogue

All University of South Australia holdings are listed in the catalogue which is accessible from the Library homepage. Eresources can be accessed using the catalogue.

Use the **My Record** function to check or renew items you have on loan, the status of requests placed, and any outstanding demerits or fees. It also shows any saved records or searches.

Requests

You may request an item on loan to another borrower or held at another campus, via the catalogue. When it is available you will be advised by email, and the item will be held for 4 days at the campus of your choice. 4 hour loan items cannot be requested.

Borrowing

- Your student ID card is also your library card. Cards are not transferable
- Always bring your own student ID card and use the self service loan machines
- You may borrow up to 20 items at one time
- You may borrow from any campus library
- You may request books from other campuses to be delivered to the campus of your choice
- You may request photocopies of journal articles from other campuses
- Practicum and placement/fieldwork students should return or have reissued any loans prior to placement to maximise the number of renewals available
- Inform the Library immediately if you lose your ID card. You are responsible for all items borrowed on it

Returns

You can return items at any campus through the chutes in the Library. After hours chutes are also available. 4 hour loans should be returned to the campus from which they were borrowed.

Demerit points and fees

The Library uses demerit points to encourage the return of borrowed library materials on time. Borrowing privileges will be suspended at a rate of 1 week for every 60 demerit points. Invoiced items incur a non-refundable fee of \$20. See the Library website for more details. www.library.unisa.edu.au/services/borrowing/demerits.asp

Renewals

Items not in demand may be renewed up to 4 times. You can do this using **My record** on the Library website or in the catalogue. You can also use **my Library** via my Resources in the Student Portal.
