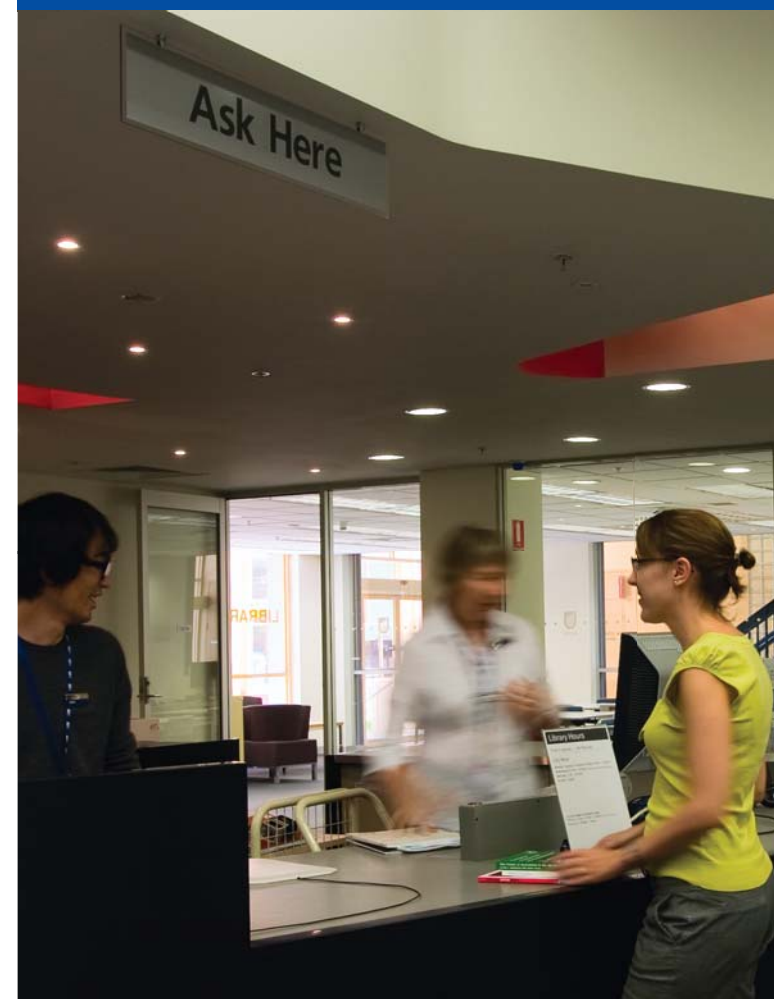

The Library is your partner in learning, offering a wide range of services to help you find, use and evaluate information effectively.

The Research Collection

It contains over 700,000 books and print journals together with a rapidly expanding collection of electronic resources of over 136,000 ebooks, 50,000 ejournals, 23,000 ereadings and 480 databases. Other resources include pictorial, audio visual materials and manuscripts.

Summon

Summon is a fast and simple search tool that enables you to find relevant information on any topic from the Library's collection of databases, print and electronic books, journals and theses, together with journal and newspaper articles from numerous academic databases. You are able to limit your results to peer-reviewed materials, to filter by year and format, and to save references for export to bibliographic management software such as Refworks or EndNote. Summon and many other Library resources specific to your course can be accessed through learnonline.

Library Catalogue

All University of South Australia holdings are listed in the catalogue, which is accessible from the Library homepage. eResources can be accessed via the catalogue.

Go to MyRecord to check or renew items you have on loan, check the status of requests placed, and any outstanding demerits or fees.

Databases

Search scholarly journals, newspapers, conference papers and books on your topic. We offer sophisticated search tools to get the most from the information we provide. How to guides provide tips on getting the most out of these resources.

Course Readings Online

We provide all readings for your courses via the Library Catalogue and course homepages. These eReadings can be accessed 24x7.

Borrowing

- You need your Student ID card to borrow using the self service loan kiosks
- You may borrow up to 20 items at one time
- You may borrow items from any campus library
- You may request photocopies of journal articles from other campuses
- Inform the University immediately if you lose your ID card as you are responsible for all items borrowed on your card

Loan periods

Main Collection

- 14 days (subject to recall)

High Demand and Restricted Loans

- 4 hour or 4 day loans

Reference Collection and Journals

- Not available for loan

Teaching Resource Collection (TRC)

- 14 days (subject to recall)

Renewals

Items not in demand may be renewed up to 4 times. You can do this via MyRecord on the Library website or in the Library Catalogue.

Returns

You can return items at any campus through the chutes in the Library. After hours chutes are also available. 4 hour loans and laptops must be returned to the Service Desk from which they were borrowed.

Demerit points

The Library uses demerit points to encourage the return of borrowed library materials by the due date. Borrowing privileges will be suspended at a rate of 1 week for every 60 demerit points.

Fees

Invoiced items incur a non-refundable fee of \$20 per item. The Library website has more details.

Requests

From the Library Catalogue you may request an item on loan to another borrower or held at another campus. When it is available, you will be advised by email and the item will be held for 4 days at the campus of your choice. 4 hour loan items cannot be requested.
