



What is Find it?

The  link may locate the full text of a journal article when you are searching Library databases. The full text of a journal article can be found if the Library has access to the journal online. For example, searching for an article by *Feldman* on the *global financial crisis* using [Academic Search Premier](#) gives this results screen:



Why does the link open to a journal's home page?

 may link to the journal home page rather than to the exact article because some publishers only offer this option. You will need to find the article from the journal's contents list.

If I'm off campus, will I be able to use ?

YES. As long as you are an enrolled UniSA student you can use **Find it**. You will need to log in with your student username and password.

When I select the link nothing happens. What's going on?

It may be that the link is to a recently published article which has not been uploaded. It could also be caused by your computer's settings which cause pop ups to be blocked. If available use the [Report an error](#) link to report any problems.

What can I do if doesn't find it?

Try [Summon](#). Check the [library catalogues](#) of the other universities to see if they have the journal. If you are a staff member or Higher Degree by Research (HDR) student you may be able to request the resources via the [Document Delivery and Interlibrary Loans Service](#).

Try search engines like [Google Scholar](#), [OAster](#) or [Scirus](#) to locate your journal article.
